S28 Geotourism

Geotourism has many aspects. One area that attracts the interest of specialists and lay people is the scenic and other generally appreciable aspects of the geological structure that underlies the vegetation or is exposed due to various types of erosion, tectonic or volcanic activities as well as the results of activities of water (flowing or still).
